Each year, we begin with a time of corporate consecration, a time where we lay aside our normal routines in order to seek the Lord. DAY 1

Agreement With God

Scripture: Amos 3:3

At the core of every believer is a desire to walk closely with God. Scripture affirms that He seeks a personal and intimate relationship with each of us, and one of the primary ways we cultivate that intimacy is by living in alignment with His will, as revealed in His Word.

Genesis 5:22 highlights the life of Enoch, whose consistent walk with God spanned three centuries. His life exemplified faithful obedience and alignment with God's purpose for his life, resulting in a testimony that he pleased God. Knowing God's will is important, but choosing to live in agreement with His will is what truly transforms our lives.

To experience the fullness of what God intends for us, we must recognize that while God never changes, we often must. Spiritual growth requires a willingness to adjust our lives so that they reflect His unchanging nature and divine purpose.

One of the greatest needs facing believers is the need for God's presence and power, all day, every day. We need to become prayer warriors who can touch the throne room of heaven and that is only possible when we live in unity with God. Only then can we move into a spiritual dimension we've never experienced before.

Prayer Point:

Earnestly seek to know and agree with God's will for your life. The level of your agreement with God will determine the degree of intimacy in your walk with Him. Pray today to walk in agreement with God so you can enjoy the life that He desires you to have in Jesus Christ.

DAY 2

Encouragement During Difficult Times

Scripture: [Hebrews 12:2 KJV](#)

Persevering through difficult times, no matter how challenging it is, can yield a reward that is everlasting. This does not mean that it will make it easier but gives us encouragement while we are experiencing trials.

Take for example Jesus, who suffered beyond anything that could compare to our suffering and endured even unto death. Because of this “God highly exalted Him and gave Him a name which is above every name.”

During your difficult seasons find comfort in knowing that Jesus our Savior identifies with your infirmities and that He has overcome the world. We too must be like Jesus by completely yielding to the Heavenly Father’s will, trusting His plan, while staying focused on Him and not our difficulties. He is an ever-present help in times of trouble. We must endure to the end, believing that one day we will see Him face to face.

DAY 3

Scriptures: Psalm 86:11, Romans 12, 2 Peter 3:17-18

Now, how many times do you tell yourself something similar when it comes to ministry? “I’ll get involved when I feel more comfortable or I’m just not that comfortable committing myself to this right now”. How long will we continue to allow comfort to stand in the way of Gods will? We so often look for the perfect fit in our walk with God or how we operate in ministry, but nothing will ever be perfect because we are still humans saved by God’s grace. Don’t continue to put off what God has placed in front of you. Our comfort isn’t the goal, obedience is. So, get out there, take the next step! God loves you for who you are, and you’ll never know how much you can impact the next person looking for a relationship with God until you step out of your comfort zone.

Prayer:

Lord, thank You for Your grace and love. Help me become the person You’ve called me to be. I know I’m not perfect, but I’m ready to step out of my comfort zone and walk boldly in Your will.

DAY 4

Surrendering for Yourself

Scripture: **Matthew 16:24.**

When you surrender on account of yourself, it brings about overwhelming peace. In denying how we feel or what we want to do can be very difficult at times. Jesus did create us, but He also gave us free will, as in this verse where He says we must deny ourselves if we want to be one of His disciples. Disciples are followers of Christ, and we have to give up even our right to be right sometimes so that God can reign supreme and get the glory out of our situations and ultimately our lives.

DAY 5

Overcomers

Scripture: **Hebrews 12:1 NLT**

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us.

It strengthens our faith to know that we have so many people cheering us on to ultimate victory in Christ. They overcame some of the same weights and sins that we must contend with.

Hebrews 11:39a says **All these people earned a good reputation because of their faith...** This refers to the people who faced many things that seemed impossible, but they never let go of their faith. We must be tenacious in standing on the word of God that tells us we have already won! We know according to **1 Corinthians 10:13** whatever the temptation, God always provides a way of escape so we can deal with whatever we have to face. Always know that we have what it takes to do like Jesus did and that is come out in the power of the Holy Ghost.

DAY 6

Samaritan Love

“So which of these three do you think was neighbor to him who fell among the thieves?” And he said, “He who showed mercy on him.” Then Jesus said to him, “Go and do likewise.” Luke 10:36-37 NKJV

What is Samaritan love? It is the kind of love that crosses lines we’d like to avoid. It’s the kind of love that moves TOWARD need and not AWAY from it.

Jesus shows us that real compassion isn’t convenient. It’s willing to STOP, SEE and RESPOND. It’s costly, intentional and takes a willingness to stop for the one that’s struggling in front of you. The Good Samaritan didn’t ask who was responsible for the problem, he looked at the situation with mercy.

Today let your love reflect Jesus: INTERRUPTIBLE, GENEROUS, and WILLING to see the person others overlook. This is how others will know you’re His disciple.

DAY 7

According to Your Faith

Scripture: “Then touched he their eyes, saying, **according to your faith** be it unto you.” Matthew 9:29

The Bible tells us that faith is the substance of things hoped for and the evidence of things not seen. This tells me that I must believe by faith that God will do what he said he will do. My faith must become the substance of my belief system. If what I see in the natural doesn’t line up with what the word of God says I must believe the word. So, then my faith must be in what the word of God says. What I see can be a distraction to attempt to alter my faith.

DAY 8

I Am A Promise

Scriptures: Jeremiah 29:11, 2 Corinthians 5: 5-21 & Psalm 51:10

"I am a promise; I am a possibility. I am a promise with a capital P... That lovely song from my childhood pops in my head every so often and I smile at the reminder that God has placed great things within us! Jeremiah 29:11 "For I know the thoughts that I think toward you, saith the Lord, thoughts of peace and not of evil to give you an expected end". This is just a reminder that we are who God says we are and nothing less! Life may be rough or things may not be going the way you thought they should but remember," ... we walk by faith and not by sight" (2 Corinthians 5:7). Let God show you who you are, don't let the outside noise distract you from the promises of God.

Today: Write down who you know God to be and then write down who you believe God made You to be.

Prayer – Ask God to help clear your mind of the distractions and false realities so you can see and become who He wants you to be.

DAY 9

From: Sin Sick World - To: Serving the Most High God

Heavenly Father, thank you for coming to my rescue. I was born into a world I did not know how I would get out of, but I was also born from a heavenly place. I can feel a pull in two directions. One pull to grow and conform to a world of sin, and another pull, a pull of transformation. The word of God answers the question I am asking in my spirit, soul, and body.

And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God. Romans 12:2.

The enemy wants to make sin fun, but sin is blinding, sin wants those that it has captured to stay forever. But when God allows the person to hear this life changing gospel the blinders come off, and now divine transformation is born. From one world to another, from sin to serving,
Heavenly Father, thank you for coming to my rescue.

DAY 10

Don't Do Life Solo

Key Scripture: Hebrews 10:24–25

24 And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, 25 not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.

God never meant for you to walk this faith out alone. Scripture calls us to “consider one another in order to stir up love and good works” and warns us to avoid “forsaking the assembling of ourselves together.” When you show up and stay connected, your gifts help strengthen others, and their encouragement strengthens you. Isolation may feel easier, but it quietly weakens you. Choose to “exhort one another”—now more than ever—as the Day approaches.

Supporting Scriptures: Ecclesiastes 4:9–12; Romans 12:4–5

Meditation: Where might God be inviting you back into meaningful connection today?

DAY 11

Lord Clean my Heart

Scripture Readings: Psalm 51; Romans 7:1-25; 8:1-8, 12:1-2

When we were born our minds and thoughts were clean and pure, unpolluted by the impurities of this world and while we're in our infancy, our minds are free from unrighteous thoughts, and we were mostly innocent and untouched by the influence of the

devil. As we go through life, we're exposed to people and things that bring us into contact with things that are sometimes inappropriate, and our minds take it all in.

As we continue to grow, we get to a point where our minds are so cluttered with negativity that we become stuck and can't grow spiritually. The result is because our process of thinking is off and it causes everything around us to suffer and we sometimes do things we wouldn't normally do because the enemy has infiltrated our minds.

To overcome this condition there's three things we need to do: #1 We must surrender our will completely to Christ and allow Him to renew our minds through communing with Him in prayer and reading and applying His word to our lives daily; #2 We must stop the flow of these unhealthy things into our minds. Unrighteous actions are preceded by unrighteous thoughts, and unrighteous thoughts are born out of unrighteous conversation, and other things associated with our flesh being satisfied. #3 We must develop an effective filtering system that removes all the impurities and cleanses the spirit and He is the Holy Spirit.

David understood that he had fallen out of the will of God and in **Psalm 51:10** asked the Lord to 'create in him a clean heart... You must release your spirit to become a powerful influence for good by getting under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Spirituality is a product of righteousness; and when you are in tune with God spiritually, He will give you what you need to handle any problem in the name of Jesus.

Prayer Focus:

Seek God's guidance to help you discard the negativity that comes up in your mind and ask Him to give you the strength to move out of the old man and move fully into the new man that is renewed in the spirit of your mind.

DAY 12

First Things First

Scripture: Matthew 6:33.

This verse challenges our focus, shifting it from anxiety and worry about tomorrow, to trusting God's provision for today. Seeking his Kingdom means aligning our will with His, letting His rule shape our decisions & desires. Pursuing His righteousness means striving to live with his character, reflecting His love and holiness. When we make honoring Him our primary goal, God promises to meet our needs—not necessarily with excess but with everything essential, freeing us from worldly anxieties.

The passage also centers on prioritizing God's reign (Kingdom) and character (righteousness) over worldly concerns, promising He'll provide for your needs. It encourages us to make Him priority in all areas of our life's work, family, and goals. By seeking His will, trusting his wisdom, and aligning your life with His standards it leads to true peace and fulfillment rather than worry. Let's reevaluate our priorities today; what truly comes first?!

Prayer: Lord, I pray for discernment, strength and direction. That you will allow me to seek and see the things that come first to you in my life. In Jesus name, amen.

DAY 13

Position Yourself

Scripture: **Isaiah 43:18-21**

The scripture came as a reminder to Israel. During this time of being in exile a long way from home, God reiterated to His chosen people that He was going to do what He said He'd do. God reminds them, I am the Holy One who delivered you from the hand of your captive. I am the God that before me there was no other. I'm still here and I'm going to do something so great that what was done in the past will not compare. But you need to change your ways so that you can be in position to receive what I'm going to do.

God is calling us to repentance. I know some of you might be saying, "I'm saved! I've already repented! But you continue to do the same things the same way you've always done them without truly changing your thoughts and actions.

God wants to do a new thing in you! Once you set your eyes on Jesus, you'll see that God has you covered! You'll see the water in the wilderness. You'll see the rivers in the desert. You'll see that the people of God are taken care of because you are His chosen. Before you were, He knew you, and cleared the path for you. God is calling us to a new place in Him. Trust God and receive the blessings stored up for you.

DAY 14

Sent Everywhere

Scripture: **Matthew 28:19-20**

Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20. teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you; and lo, I am with you always, even to the end of the age." Amen.

Jesus didn't just speak to the crowd—He spoke to you. He said, “Go,” not sit still, and “make disciples,” not just attend church services. You carry the message everywhere you walk—into your job, your family, your circle, your community. As you love, serve, teach, and share, remember His promise: “I am with you always.” Your story matters. Your gifts matter. Your obedience matters. God can use your everyday life, right where you are, to pull someone closer to Him.

Supporting Scriptures: Acts 1:8; 1 Peter 4:10

Meditation: Where is Jesus asking you to “go” and represent Him today?

DAY 15

Where Can Wisdom be Found

Scripture: **Job 28:12**

But where can wisdom be found? And where is the place of understanding?

Many times in life we find ourselves at a place where we have no answers and our resources have been exhausted. In other words, we simply don't know what to do. Feeling overwhelmed and overextended mentally, emotionally and even physically. In a tizzy, we reach in every direction trying to find what we need. Man has been looking in all the wrong places for answers that are sound only in the Creator of the universe. The answer to life does not originate with man, but with God.

Job 28:13 says: **Man does not know its value, Nor is it found in the land of the living.** The wisdom man needs to live a purposeful fulfilled has an origin that is supernatural. No one can find it in the natural world. God understand the way to wisdom, He knows where it can be found (**Job 28:23 NLT**). Approaching God's word hungry, thirsty and sometimes desperate is the way we have to do it. No such thing as giving up until we've obtained the answer that we need. It's in getting the knowledge of God, taking the time to understand it and applying it to our lives. That's where wisdom can be found... no where else but in God.

DAY 16

Be Blessed

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, Ephesians 1:3 NKJV

Be blessed: we say it like it's the Christian slang of the day that we have some control over. But the truth is God's blessing over your life is already complete IN Christ.

Before you face anything today, He has declared you CHOSEN, LOVED, FORGIVEN and EQUIPPED. Living under the blessing of God is not about circumstances but about alignment. You must align your heart, choices and expectations with God.

God's blessing is not fragile or seasonal. It's not dependent on who approves of you. It is anchored in Christ.

As you move through your day, walk into your blessing not as a moment, but as a mindset.

You're not trying to earn God's favor! You're living from the blessing He has already poured out on you...in Christ.

Be blessed!

DAY 17

Seek God First

Scripture: Matthew 6:33

But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

In life I've sought many things and found myself wanting. Many of those things have led me into pleasures that were temporary and fizzled out over time. Once I made up my mind up to seek Gods kingdom and righteousness first, he lined me up in a path that brought fulfillment and completion. Seeking God first changed the flow of my life that was full of choices that caused a lot of redoes that were costly. I thank God that he is a God of another chance.

DAY 18

Liberated By Christ

Sometimes in our lives we experience what feels like an endless cycle. The place where you feel like you're going through the same struggles, mistakes, hardships and they seem to repeat themselves. There is a feeling of disappointment and discouragement when you realize you're doing it again or you see it repeatedly in your family. But God's power is stronger than our patterns. He set up a plan from the beginning for our struggles. In **Galatians 5:1 KJV** it tells us, **"Stand fast therefore in the liberty wherewith Christ has made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage."**

God recognizes that our struggles sometimes lie deeper than what realize. And we need help to first recognize, then deal with our issues. So He gave us His Word and the Holy Spirit to help us overcome them. Therefore, we shouldn't just receive His Word as good advice, but allow it to penetrate our total being (heart, mind, and soul). Jesus died to destroy the power of sin and the destructive works of the enemy in our lives. So when you feel like your back is against the wall, call on Jesus! Allow the power of God to work on your behalf breaking down cycles and destroying yokes that seem impossible on your own.

DAY 19

Free Smile

Scripture: **Proverbs 17:22 NLT** A cheerful heart is good medicine, but a broken spirit saps a person's strength.

A smile may seem small, but God sometimes uses simple things to make a big difference.

A smile costs nothing, yet it can lift a weary heart, soften tension or remind someone they are seen.

When joy flows from Christ within you, your smile becomes more than just a facial expression...it becomes MINISTRY!

Today let your smile be an offering of grace. Share it freely, generously and intentionally. You never know what burden it may lift.

So, smile today and show the love of Christ.

DAY 20

A Relationship with Jesus

Scriptures: **John 16:33, Philippians 4:6-7, John 14:27, and Isaiah 24:3, John 14:1, John 1:12**

As Christians the most important relationship that we can have is with Jesus. This relationship is essential and foundational because it keeps us anchored to Him and to our Heavenly Father. In obedience we must nourish our relationship daily by spending time through prayer, living a Christ-like life, reading the word of God, and remembering the ultimate sacrifice that Jesus made for us when He died on the cross.

His finished work on the cross paid for our sins. **John 14:6** "Jesus answered, I am the way, The truth, and the life. No one can come to the Father except through me". What other relationships could be more impactful in our lives? Intentionally connecting with Jesus daily allows us to experience His everlasting presence, eternal power, and enduring peace.

DAY 21

Scripture: Psalm 27:14
